Parishwide Proposition

Summary: Renewal of the 1.23 mills property tax for a period of 10 years for the purpose of providing funds to purchase, maintain and operate machinery, facilities and equipment necessary in the eradication, abatement or control of mosquitoes and rodents, and maintaining adequate administrative and support staff in connection therewith.

Shall the Parish of East Baton Rouge, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), under the provisions of Article VI, Section 30 of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, and other constitutional and statutory authority, be authorized to renew the levy and collection, and adopt an ordinance providing for such levy and collection, of a special tax of 1.23 mills on the dollar of assessed valuation on all property subject to taxation within the boundaries of the Parish (the "tax") (an estimated \$4,180,000 is reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for the entire year), for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the tax collection for the year 2014, and annually thereafter to and including the year 2023, the proceeds of said tax to be used entirely and exclusively to provide funds to purchase, maintain and operate machinery, facilities and equipment necessary and useful in the eradication, abatement or control of mosquitoes, other arthropods of public health importance and rodents, title to which shall be in the public, and maintaining and providing for adequate administrative and support staff in connection therewith?
